
Hunter Netball acknowledges the First People of Australia and of the lands that make up the major tribal groups in the Hunter region where we live, work and play.

The Junior State Titles hosted by Camden Netball Association, saw Hunter Netball Boys 14Us have a successful title, coming away as Runners Up in 2023 and taking away the highly regarded blue patch and trophy, with four wins and just two losses.

In 2023, Hunter Netball was pleased to see our Hunter Netball Associations take the lead for this representative pathway at the Senior State Titles.

With Hunter Netball Associations well represented which showed on the final ladders of each division.

Newcastle Netball Association Open Male Division 1 team placing 5th with five wins and seven losses across their weekend.

Open Male Division 2 saw Charlestown Netball Association take home 3rd place with ten wins and four losses, whilst Kurri Kurri Netball Association came away placing 6th on the ladder with five wins and 9 losses.

On the court – Hunter Netball Summer Series

Off the back of a successful 2022 KBA Insurance Repairs - Hunter Netball Summer Series, Hunter Netball is again offering this competition in 2023.

Whilst this competition offers the Hunters best teams to come together in female, male and mixed divisions for athletes over the age of 15 years. It has also proven to be a strong competition for Hunter umpires to obtain coaching weekly that they may not receive throughout the playing season. This has been particularly important pathway for several smaller Associations where umpires are often required to support and develop locally their umpires through the regular season often at the neglect of their own development as National Badged umpires.

The umpiring program has been led by National A Umpires Monique Smith and Lauren Hill and will continue again in 2023.

Coaches also benefited in season 2022 with Marion Van Muster providing coaching guidance to team coaches across the Summer Series.

The 2023 KBA Insurance Hunter Summer Series will kick off again in October, for 8 exciting weeks of netball hosted across several Hunter Netball Associations.

Off the court - Community Engagement

Hunter Netball has strong, and positive working relationships with the Councils in each of the Hunter Local Government Areas, as well as our State and Federal Members of Parliament. With a strong acumen in government

relationships, Hunter Netball understands the importance of working with and for our community.

Hunter Netball supported Aspire Netball again in 2023 for the 11 Years Development Day, that brings together literally hundreds of excited 11-year-olds from across NSW to participate in a great day of learning and netball fun.



Aspire Netball bring together local Academies, Hunter Netball, and the Central Coast Heart to collectively provide the program that promotes sport, netball, fun and all whilst raising money for Confident Girls Foundation.



Hunter Netball further partnered with Aspire Netball through their development programs offering match play for athletes.



Hunter Netball participated in the Girls Day Out (Women in Sport) event in January, aimed at girls aged 6 to 16 to try new sports, and to meet

professional athletes, learn new skills and be inspired. This year's event in the iconic Newcastle foreshore district.





Off the court



Hunter Netball remains committed to being an enabler for Hunter netballers to progress through their pathway, as part of the broader netball ecosystem across the Hunter.

Through our relationships with each of the 13 Hunter Netball Associations that provide grassroots and Representative Netball pathways, to the Hunter Academy of Sport, and through the supporting netball programs provided by ASPIRE Netball, NettyHeads and similar offerings across the Hunter.

Hunter Netball is committed to supporting the boys and mens growth in the game, whilst maintaining a positive Metro League experience. Our aim remains to obtain a future Premier League licence but in the meantime as the Netball NSW Premier League Commission works towards their ideal competition, we will continue to support Hunter athletes to pursue opportunities with existing licensees, including Central Coast Heart as our nearest licence.

Hunter Netball Premier League

Hunter Netball put forward expressions of interest in the 2023 selection process for a 10th licence to the Netball NSW Premier League Competition from season 2024.

On 22 August Hunter Netball was advised that we had not been successful, with a later announcement that week advising the netball community that South West Mounties Magic was the successful contender for the 10th licence from season 2024.

Hunter Netball Board met with Netball NSW CEO Tracey Scott and General Manager Communities Tim Fava to further discuss on 4 September. The following feedback was shared with Hunter Netball Board Members.

- Premier League Commission received three submissions from Hills Alliance, South West Mounties Magic and Hunter Netball
- Due to the high quality of all three submission Netball NSW explored moving to a 12-team model for the competition with a possibility of a phased approach to 12 teams over 2 years.
- Netball NSW held discussions with the existing 9 Premier League licences as is required under their agreements on moving to a 12-team model for the competition. The existing licensees were not advised who the applications were received from.
- Based on their feedback and further exploration by Netball NSW on sustainability and growth data of athlete participation in all areas it was considered best to remain with a 10-team model in 2024.
- South West Mounties Magic was considered to have greater athlete growth based on current registration volumes (including growth through COVID impacted years) and noted the footprint covers an NSW population growth corridor and will draw from Liverpool, Camden and Bankstown Associations.
- Netball NSW acknowledges because of the engagement with Premier League teams on a 12-team model this impacted on the original timeframe advertised for the process and note that they impacted to the delay in communication of the outcome.
- Netball NSW acknowledges that they have an obligation to consult on new models but do not want that to mean long drawn-out process - it is Netball NSW view that there should be progression towards an extended competition within the next 3 years - the format of what this looks like would be based on consultation and must ensure the financial viability of all license holders.

- Netball NSW advised they felt it was important that there was a South Western Sydney opportunity if the competition was to remain at a 10team model.
- Netball NSW advised that further discussions will be held with the 9
 Premier League licences 6 September as part of the postseason
 engagement, where they expected to discuss further expansion of the
 Premier League Competition as part of their vision, and possible
 standards and measures of success to be introduced under future
 models for the betterment of the game.
- Netball NSW noted that there is also a need to look at the relationship between Premier League and Metro League so that both competition pathways create the value proposition that is required to support netball pathways.
- Netball NSW are committed to working with Hunter Netball and NSW regions more broadly about regional pathways / models.

Hunter Netball will continue to support our athletes in their endeavours to progress to the Premier League.

Hunter Netball also acknowledges the new Premier League community partners who committed to supporting our bid for Premier League and will continue to work with these partners on other opportunities over the coming years.

Hunter Netball Infrastructure

With a change of government in NSW in March 2023, Hunter Netball has allowed the incoming government time to find their feet before connecting further on Infrastructure opportunities.

Informal and formal engagements have occurred with Minister for Sport, Stephen Kamper and his office since June, with further meeting with Sports NSW, Netball NSW and Hunter Netball to occur in the near future.

Hunter Netball will continue to work in the best interests of netball across the Hunter as we progress this work.

Our Governance

Hunter Netball is compliant with Australian and NSW laws and has maintained incorporation with Fair Trading NSW since May 2022 under the name of Hunter Netball Incorporation.

With this registration Hunter Netball is required under the Act to report the following:

- Financial Statement must be submitted to the Annual General Meeting
- Must lodge with Fair Trading annual summary of financial affairs.
- Lodge / notify of any changes to appointment of public office within 28 days of any changes to person / address.

Our Finances

During the 2022-2023 financial year the total revenue for Hunter Netball was \$32,937.00 Sponsorships from our Community Partners was the prime revenue for the period, followed by Association Memberships.

Our expenditure for the same period was \$17,858.20, with our main expenses being court hire for training venues.

Closing bank balance as of 30 June 2023 being \$37,442.64.
